PIKES PEAK

Reaching 14,110 feet, scenic Pikes Peak is accessible via car year-round (weather permitting). Home of the Pikes Peak Hill Climb, the second oldest car race in America, and the Pikes Peak Marathon, Kathryn Lee Bates penned "America the Beautiful" in 1893 after visiting this incredible summit. THE BROADMOOR'S PIKES PEAK COG RAILWAY

For 114 years, the Manitou and Pikes Peak Railway (the world's highest cog railroad, the highest Colorado railroad, and highest train in the United States) has taken passengers to the 14,110 foot summit of Pikes Peak. CHEYENNE MOUNTAIN ZOO

Experience America's "highest" zoo at 6,800 feet. Named one of TripAdvisor's Top 10 Zoos in the U.S., Cheyenne Mountain Zoo features
