John Raley obtained a B.A. in Letters from the University of Oklahoma, and earned his J.D. at Oklahoma University Law Center. On a Rotary Fellowship, he obtained a LL.M. in International Law from the University of Aberdeen, Scotland. Prior to founding Raley & Bowick, John was a litigation partner at Fulbright & Jaworski, L.L.P. and the managing partner of the Houston office of Cooper & Scully, P.C. He has been first chair trial counsel in over 40 jury trials in complex matters (including seven where damages of over \$50 million were sought). His tenacity and skill are internationally recognized, and he has been featured in or interviewed by CNN, *The Texas Tribune*, *Texas Monthly*, *The New York Times*, *The Wall Street Journal*, NPR, Katie Couric and 60 Minutes. In 2013, *Texas Lawyer* magazine named John one of the top five "Impact Players" of Texas.

John was given a 2013 Presidential Citation by the Texas State Bar in recognition of his seven year *pro bono* fight in state and federal courts for DNA testing in order to exonerate Michael Morton, an innocent man who served 25 years in prison. The resultant landmark Michael Morton Act requires prosecutors to provide defense counsel free access to investigation information.
