Kohala Waterfall Hike (\$)

Tuesday, July 11 and Wednesday, July 12, 12:00 - 5:30 P.M.

Stunning private waterfalls, tranquil streams, scenic coastlines, and rugged valleys, this is what Hawaii is about. Explore the north end of the Big Island and hike through an ancient Hawaiian agricultural site and a private nature reserve. Soak in soaring sea cliffs, remote valleys, and even go for a swim under one of seven waterfalls.

The registration fee is \$260 USD per person and includes roundtrip transportation, guides, exclusive hike and lunch locations, a picnic lunch, and hiking gear (walking sticks, repellent, etc.).

Important Details

- Departs Fairmont Orchid: 12:00 p.m./Returns to Fairmont Orchid: 5:30 p.m.
- This activity involves a 1-2 mile walk. Participants should be in reasonably good physical condition and should be able to hike on uneven terrain. This activity is not recommended for those who are pregnant or who have back or neck problems.
- Children must be accompanied by a parent/guardian. Children 3 years and younger must be carried in participant's own child backpack.
- Wear comfortable closed-toe walking shoes (i.e. sneakers, hiking boots, or closed-toe sports sandals).
- A bathing suit should be worn under clothing and a hat, sunglasses, and sunscreen are recommended.
- Bring a towel and a light sweatshirt or pullover for the return trip.

As the name suggests, the island of Hawaii – known as The Big Island – is the largest of the Hawaiian island chain. Home to two active volcanoes, lush rainforests, and incredible beaches, there is something for everyone to enjoy. **Below are a few of the popular tours available on the island that you can book directly through the hotel or through reputable tour companies on the island. Umauma Falls Zipline

Soar over a beautiful river gorge, a lush fern grotto, and a lava tube. See 14 waterfalls and stop at the exclusive Umauma Falls lookout. Take in the fantastic views of the ocean and Maunakea from an elevated vantage point and keep an eye out for a native Hawaiian hawk.

Manta Ray Night Snorkel

Have an unforgettable experience exclusively available on the Big Island: Go for an unforgettable evening swim with manta rays! Let the stars above illuminate the sea as these gentle ocean creatures glide through the saltwater atmosphere. Your swim with manta rays is guaranteed to be an evening of marine magic.

Big Island Stargazing

The Big Island Stargazing Tour is a unique experience that offers visitors of all ages unparalleled views of the stars from Mauna Kea. See the Milky Way in all its glory and the vast array of stars and planets on display. Learn about the fascinating science of stargazing while taking in the breathtaking views of the night sky through telescopes.

Kona Snorkel Experience

Some of the best snorkeling in Hawaii can be found in south Kona. The waters are calm and clear, making it a perfect spot for spotting dolphins and honu (Hawaiian green sea turtles), as well as dozens of varieties of tropical fish. Be transported to this underwater wonderland on a top-of-the-line catamaran with two decks, a 15-ft. high jump, and a 20-ft. water slide.

Submarine Dive

An unforgettable 45-minute journey aboard an Atlantis 48-passenger submarine, as featured in National Geographic television specials, where guests explore a 25-acre natural coral reef and its marine inhabitants. The Atlantis submarine dive is one of the most popular tours in Kona.

Big Island Helicopter Tour

The towering sea cliffs open into the dramatically deep and meandering valleys of the Kohala Mountains. Beautiful waterfalls cascade thousands of feet into the rainforest below and remnants of ancient Hawaiian settlements are still visible. This tour was voted #1 by The Travel Channel as the "World's Best Helicopter Thrill." Tour routes and sights visited may vary according to wind and weather conditions. Volcanic activity varies hourly.
