

#### My Kind of Town: Chicago

The Windy City is host to many IADC meetings each year. In this location series episode, Chicago local and *IADC Speaks* Host Rebecca Weinstein Bacon (Barlit Beck LLP) speaks with fellow members and local experts Shayna Cook (Goldman Ismail Tomaselli Brennan & Baum LLP) and J.T. Wilson (Epstein Becker & Green, P.C.) about all things Chicago. In this episode, you'll get recommendations for food and activities based on neighborhoods, keeping the April/May season in mind when IADC meetings will be taking place.

Here are recommendations mentioned during the episode, in order:

### RIVER NORTH - close to The Ritz-Carlton, Chicago

- Flight Club Looking for fun? Come here to play darts.
- SPIN Chicago Near Flight Club but looking for a different activity? Spin Chicago has ping pong.
- Sunda Fantastic fresh sushi spot. Rebecca recommends the "tale of two tunas."
- <u>Hampton Social</u> Coastal-inspired food, great for a group.
- <u>Aire Ancient Baths</u> Unique and aesthetically pleasing spa. Located in a historic industrial building from 1902, expect 15-ish different rooms. From a salt room to different temperature baths, this is a spa you'll want to experience. The ambiance and relaxation are off the charts.

## **WEST LOOP**

- Randolph Street for boutiques and chain stores.
- Stephanie Izard restaurants <u>Girl and the Goat</u> is a big one, but Chef Izard has 4 or 5 others in the area. Check out <u>Cabra</u> (Peruvian-inspired cuisine) at the top of the Hoxton Hotel. Great for a group. There are two outdoor spaces that are heated great for unpredictable April!
- <u>Trivoli Tavern</u> for Italian.
- Elske for Nordic cuisine.
- <u>"The B Line"</u> This is a stretch where murals are found, done by different artists. A great pre or
  post dinner activity.
- Ramen-san Ramen.
- Aba Mediterranean and a vibe.
- Riccardo Osteria Authentic Northern Italian.
- <u>Eleven Eleven</u> American.
- Supper Club
- WNDR Museum interactive experience, family friendly.

• <u>Soho House</u> – Stay at the hotel to access some of the restaurants, or check out the Fox Bar or Lobby Bar without being a member or having to stay in the hotel.
