

- In its second edition, the Minds & Hearts study analyses how courts in Europe have assessed cartel overcharges.
- The study is based on a comprehensive review of cartel damages claims in which courts have handed out one or several judgment on the merits.
 - Cases settled before any judgment on the merits are not included
- The edition 2017 was completed between June and Sept. 2017, and it covers the EU 28 + Norway and Switzerland
- The identification of the cases was carried out with the assistance of 110 lawyers, law professors and experts (at least two in each country).
- This research is subject to three main limitations :
 - Cases have possibly been omitted
 - Some judgments are not final
 - As judgments were written in 10 different languages, errors in interpreting some of their content cannot be excluded

By type of decision


Courts in Europe have handed down judgments on the merits in 98 cartels damages claims (at least)

By country


Cartel damages claims have been assessed by courts in 12 European countries


