Mr. Goodman led numerous high-profile enforcement actions, landmark consent orders, litigations (including matters before the U.S. Supreme Court and D.C. Circuit), rulemakings and special projects to successful resolution. He collaboratively led some of the largest civil enforcement actions and recalls in the history of NHTSA - including the largest and most complex safety recall in U.S. history - involving nearly 70 million airbag inflators and tens of millions of vehicles subject to recall by 2019. Mr. Goodman also led teams in matters throughout DOT and across multiple transportation modes, including pipeline safety, hazardous materials, urban transit, motor carrier, aviation economic regulatory, and maritime matters.
