# Digitization and its Impact on the Labor Market and Employment Law

Digitization – the diffusion of digital technologies into nearly every market - has greatly impacted the world of work. One impact digitization has had is widespread anxiety because humans worry about their future in an age of machines that may take their jobs. Little data exists to track the spread of digital adoption. This Webinar will explore how digitization in the last ten years has resulted in scalable change. While the degree and pace vary widely among industries, this Webinar will focus on the high points of concern and evolution and its effect on employment law issues including impact on pay, jobs, and liabilities.
