In the United States, reported cases of Legionnaires' disease have grown by nearly four and a half times since 2000. Whether due to a true increase in incidence or improved diagnostics, the flurry of legal and industry response in recent years has been substantial. This Webinar will address significant developments in recent years regarding scientific advances and industry response to issues of Legionella prevention, control, remediation, and the corresponding impact on liability.
