WannaCry? Counseling Clients Facing Ransomware Attacks

Last May, the global WannaCry attack captured the world's attention and put a spotlight on the rapidly proliferating ransomware phenomenon. While WannaCry ended up as a non-issue (only \$40,000 in Bitcoin was paid for WannaCry), ransomware attacks are shutting businesses down every day. Companies represented by IADC members are undoubtedly among the targets. Our clients need guidance on how to prepare for, and to address, these attacks if and when they come.
